I. GENERAL INFORMATION

- A. The Speed-up Rule will be used as it relates to runners. This privilege will be optional to each coach.
 - A courtesy runner may be used for the pitcher and/or catcher.
 The same runner may not be used for both positions. Neither
 the pitcher nor the catcher will be required to leave the game
 under such circumstances.
 - Players who have participated in the game in any other capacity are ineligible to serve as courtesy runners. A player may not run as a courtesy runner for the pitcher or the catcher and then be used as a runner or batter for another player in that half inning.
- B. Team uniforms should conform to Rule 1-4-1-2-3-4, National Federation <u>Baseball Rules Book</u>. Teams purchasing new uniforms should be aware of the rule that relates to numbering and size of numbers.
- All varsity and junior varsity contests must use WVSSAC registered officials.
- D. Any high school player or coach who is ejected from a contest must sit out the next three scheduled contests at that level and all other contests in the interim. Middle school/9th grade ejections result in a two game suspension.
- E. Remember that it is mandatory for players to use the NOCSAE approved batting helmet and NOCSAE approved catcher's head-gear. Refer to Rule 1-5-1-2-3-4-5 of the National Federation <u>Baseball Rules Book</u>.
- F. The Wilson A1010 is the official baseball adopted by the WVS-SAC. It will be used in all Sectional, Regional and State Tournament play. All baseballs used during games must have the National Federation Authenticating Mark.
- G. High school varsity coaches are reminded to rate game officials and send the report to the WVSSAC office at <u>mid-season</u> and at the end of the season.
- H. Use of Tobacco: The use of tobacco or tobacco-like products is prohibited by officials, coaches, players, and team attendants during a contest. A player or coach detected using tobacco will be ejected and will not be allowed to re-enter. They will also sit out the next three regularly scheduled games.
- I. Points of Emphasis:
 - Sportsmanship of Coaches, Players and Fans-Always remember the importance of sportsmanship to the game.

- Coach's Uniform-Coaches must be in the same uniform as the players, however, coaches will be allowed to wear pullover or jacket in school colors. Coaches occupying coaching boxes must be in the same color jacket (if wearing a jacket).
- Only coaches, players or eligible substitutes in proper uniform may occupy the coaching box.
- Officials should submit a Special Report when a safety situation is discovered at a playing field.
- The same baseball, type and brand name, must be used for the entire game.

J. Pregame Warm-up Procedures

The following are recommended warm-up procedures for the regular season, sectional, and regional games.

- When the visiting team arrives at the game field, the home team will immediately begin its infield practice (not to exceed 15 minutes).
- When the home team has completed its pregame infield practice, the visiting team will begin its infield practice (not to exceed 15 minutes).
- Following the completion of pregame infield practice by both teams, the game umpires will meet at home plate with representatives from both teams (head coaches and/or captains) to discuss ground rules and present each team's starting line-up and batting order no later than 5 minutes before game time.

This specific procedure will hopefully encourage schools to be ready to "play ball" when game time arrives and to stipulate a procedure of pregame warm-up when it is obvious the game will not begin on schedule because of a late arriving visiting team or potential gamesmanship by coaches.

 The pitcher is not allowed to throw warm-up pitches to the plate during infield practice.

K. Bats

Bats that are altered from the manufacturer's original design and production, or that do not meet the rule specifications, are illegal. No artificial or intentional means shall be used to control the temperature of the bat. No foreign substance may be inserted into the bat. Bats that are broken, cracked or dented or that deface the ball, i.e., tear the ball, shall be removed without penalty. A bat that continually discolors the ball may be removed from the game with no penalty at the discretion of the umpire.

II. RULES AND REGULATIONS:

A. Pitching Rule

- 1. Number of innings pitched per day:
 - 1-3 innings requires no rest, (Notes 1 & 2)
 - 4-5 innings requires 2 days of rest
 - 6-7 innings requires 3 days of rest
 - 8+ innings requires 4 days of rest.
- Note a: Any pitcher pitching on consecutive days may not exceed 7 total innings.
 - b: Any pitcher pitching on consecutive days must have a minimum of 1 day rest. If pitching more than 3 innings on consecutive days, they must have the required rest for total innings pitched (on consecutive days).
 - c: A pitcher can't pitch more than 9 innings in one game.
- In the event of a double header (or 2+ games in one day), a
 pitcher may not pitch in consecutive games unless they
 pitch 3 innings or less in the day's first contest. Any pitcher
 who pitched more than 3 innings in their first game cannot



- pitch the rest of the day. The pitcher can only pitch a total of 7 innings in consecutive games on the same day. No pitcher may pitch in 3 games in one day.
- When the ball becomes live, any substitute pitcher just entering the ball game will be credited with an inning pitched. If it is discovered after the ball becomes live that the player is ineligible to pitch, he must be removed from the game as a pitcher immediately.
- 4. A calendar day refers to sunrise of the following day.
- 5. It is the responsibility of each head coach to keep pitching information and records of appearance current and available in case the opponent or WVSSAC requests information. A violation of these provisions shall cause a game to be forfeited, head coach suspended for three (3) games, and the pitcher may not pitch the next three (3) games.

6. Middle School

- Middle School pitcher may pitch only 5 innings in one calendar day.
- b. Number of innings pitched per day:
 - 1 2 innings require 1 day of rest
 - 3 5 innings requires 3 days of rest

B. Ending a Game:

- The ten (10) run rule will be in effect for all season games including all tournament games.
- 2. All tournament games will be seven (7) innings except when the ten (10) run rule is in effect. Tournament games stopped because of rain, lightning, etc., will be resumed at the point of interruption and continue for the regulation seven (7) innings. The suspended game rule may be used during regular season by mutual agreement of both coaches unless required by league rules to continue suspended games.
- By mutual agreement of both participating coaches prior to the start of the junior-varsity game, a J.V. game may be less than seven (7) innings.
- 4. In games involving middle school baseball teams, a single contest will be seven (7) innings. If playing a doubleheader, one game will be seven (7) innings and one will be five (5) innings. In a seven (7) inning game, the ten (10) run rule will be in effect following the fifth (5th) inning. In a five (5) inning game, a twelve (12) run rule will be in effect following the third (3rd) inning. No suspended games will be allowed should a game be terminated because of darkness or weather.

III. TOURNAMENTS

A. SECTIONAL TOURNAMENT (May 9 - 21, 2016)

- The principal or his/her designate of the first named school in each section is asked to call a meeting of school representatives in his/her section to select a site, tournament director, officials, etc. The meeting should take place no later than Friday of Week 41 (April 15).
- 2. May 9, 2015 All Sectionals may begin
- All Sectionals must be completed by Saturday, Week 46 -May 21, 2016.
- All games must be played on consecutive days (weather permitting) once the tournament begins.
- 5. Sectionals may be double elimination.
- If a winner cannot be determined by Saturday May 21, 2016, the tournament winner will be determined by reverting to a

- single elimination format.
- Tournament Directors are also reminded to use only Class I and II officials and to file pre-tournament pairings, post-tournament results, and financial statements with the WVSSAC. Forms may be found in the <u>Director's Manual</u>.
- 8. The official party for reimbursement is twenty (20). However, a total of twenty-five (25) may be in the dugout. Sectional and Regional Directors are to enforce this rule.
- The West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission will provide each Sectional and Regional winner with a championship plaque at no charge for 2016.

B. REGIONAL TOURNAMENT (May 23-28, 2016)

- The Regional Director will select umpires for all regional games. Umpires are to be Class I. Directors should cooperate with participating schools for selection of umpires; however, the final decision will be made by the Regional Director.
- The WVSSAC will provide each region with a championship plaque.
- The Regional Director is responsible for the entire game management and filing financial reports with WVSSAC.
- 4. Participating schools and officials shall receive proper and adequate notice of any change in scheduling.
- The Regional Director shall purchase six (6) Wilson A1010 baseballs per game. The expense will be charged against the tournament proceeds. Baseballs will be divided between the participating schools after the game.
- Finances A financial report will be prepared for each regional game. Profit or loss should be shared by the teams in each game.

Changes in game sites and times - If changes occur, officials that were originally assigned must be given first consideration to work the rescheduled contest.

Listed below are scheduled Rules Clinics for Baseball during the 2014-2015 school year.

SCHOOLS: The **Head Coach** shall be required to attend any sports rules clinics which are sponsored by this Commission in his/her coaching assignment. Schools failing to have a head coaching position filled at the time of the clinic will be required to have a school representative present at the rules clinic. An individual can only represent one school unless he/she is head coach at both schools. In a 9-12 school, both the varsity and 9th grade coach are required to attend. Middle School head coach must attend.

The clinic attendance requirement will not be granted if the coach or representative is late in excess of 10 minutes.

- A. The Wilson NFHS 9011BSST yellow optic red stitch raised ball is the official state ball. The Wilson ball is required for all levels (sectional, regional, and state) of the tournament structure.
 - The ball must display the COR .47, NF authenticating mark, and the compression of $375\,\mathrm{lbs}$.
- B. All sectional, regional games must be played on softball fields with dirt infields. Every attempt should also be made for regular season games.
- C. Use of Tobacco: The use of tobacco or tobacco-like products is prohibited by officials, coaches, players, and team attendants during a contest. A player or coach detected using tobacco will be ejected from the contest.
- D. It is strongly recommended that the coach be attired in the same uniform as the team. If the coach is not attired in the team uniform, he/she must be attired in clothing of the school colors, white, black, gray or khaki. Coaches are allowed to wear jerseys/coaching shirts, coaching shorts/slacks or warm-up suits provided the clothing is of the school colors or white, black, gray or khaki. It is further required that the jersey/coaching shirt reflect the school name and/or logo. Cut-offs, fleece, or any type of jeans of any color are prohibited. Coaches for each team are not required to be in identical dress; however, each coach must comply with the regulations (colors, logo, etc.,).
- E. For regular season games to avoid unnessary delay of the scheduled start time, it is recommended that the home team warmup first.
- F. The WVSSAC Board of Directors has approved that all temporary body markings and face paint must be removed. Permanent body markings must be covered if the game official determines the marking is objectionable. Note: This is an official's determination and is not protestable.
- G. All sectional and regional receipts or expenses shall be shared by participating schools.

II. RULES AND REGULATIONS

- A. Fast pitch rules will be used for all middle and high school programs.
- B. The Maximum Team and Player Contests for high school is 32 games exclusive of sectional, regional, and state contests.
- C. Middle school teams and players may play 18 games including tournaments sanctioned by the WVSSAC. Middle School/9th Grade varsity teams must play 7 inning games. Note that the 10 and 8 run rules also remain in effect.
- D. At all school levels (middle school or high school), <u>subvarsity</u> games may be limited to 1 hour 30 minutes (provided the

inning has been completed) or 7 innings or conclusion of the game - See Game Rules (Tie Breaker). The choice of these two game ending procedures <u>must</u> be determined by the coaches prior to the start of the game. This decision is to be communicated to the officials at the **pre-game conference**. If coaches cannot reach agreement, the game will be seven innings. Note that the 10 and 8 run rules would also remain in effect.

- E. Players' Uniforms: The following are points of emphasis in addition to the regulations specified in the <u>National Federation Softball Rules</u> Book:
 - All helmets shall have a permanently affixed Manufacturer Certified NOCSAE Stamp (Rule 1-6-1). Also, all helmets shall be equipped with NOCSAE approved face protector (Rule 1-6-6).
 - Players' uniforms are to be worn as manufactured. Example shirts must be tucked in and sleeves not rolled up.
 - Players' shirts All shirts must be tucked in. If the shirt
 comes out during play, players are to correct at the next
 opportune time. Failure to do so will result in a team
 warning. On the next occurrence, the player will be
 restricted to the dugout.
- F. Game Rules: The <u>National Federation Softball Rules</u> will govern all play. In addition, the following rules are emphasized:
 - Rule 4-2-2 Game ending procedure after 4 1/2 or 5 innings if one team is ahead by eight (8) runs. This will be in effect for all regular season games and all tournament play.
 - 2. A 10 run rule after 3 innings and before 4 1/2 innings will be in effect for regular season play only.
 - International Tie Breaker The Tie Breaker may only be used in regular season and at the beginning of the 8th inning; however, there must be mutual consent of both coaches before the game begins. If there is not mutual consent, the Tie Breaker may not be used.
 - National Federation Rule 4-2-6: While using the tie-breaker, each half-inning begins by placing a runner on second base. That runner is the player in the batting order who precedes the lead off batter in that inning. Then the game proceeds a full inning or until a winner is determined in that inning.
 - 4. All post season games will be played under suspended game rules. A suspended game is a game to be completed at a later date. Tournament games stopped because of rain, lightning, etc., will be resumed at the point of interruption and continue for the regulation seven (7) innings; the eight (8) run rule will be in effect for sectional, regional, and state tournament play.
 - 5. During Regular Season, Suspended Games rule may be used if coaches mutually agree <u>prior</u> to the start of the game.
 - Game Ending Procedures for Invitational Tournaments: The
 option to use hour and a half or 5 inning game ending procedure will be determined by the Tournament Director and participating schools should be notified.
 - 7. Pitching Rule: No pitcher shall pitch more than fourteen (14) innings in any one (1) day period. One (1) pitch is considered an inning pitched. There is no "lay over" regulation for softball pitchers. If the rule is violated, the head coach will be suspended for the next three (3) games and the pitcher will not be allowed to pitch in the next three (3) games. However, she may play another position during those three games.
 - 8. A courtesy runner for the pitcher or catcher may be used.

III. POINTS OF EMPHASIS

- Schools must use <u>WVSSAC registered</u> officials for all softball contests.
- B. At the pre-game conference, officials are to give each head coach an officials' introductory card indicating the officials' names and registration numbers. It is important that officials also sign the scorebook. At that time, game ending procedures should be agreed upon.
- C. Coaches are reminded that good sportsmanship must be emphasized and practiced at all times by coaches, players, and spectators. If a coach or player is ejected from a contest, coaches should refer to WVSSAC Rule 127-4-3 Code for Interscholastic Athletics. In clarification, when a coach is ejected, he/she is required to leave the vicinity and is not allowed to coach at the next three played contests at that level. At the next three played contests, the coach is not allowed to have any contact with the team. This includes warming up the team or representing the team by wearing the team uniform to the game. He/she must be out of sight and sound.
- Coaches are to review the Non-School Participation Rule with all players.
- E. Double First Base may be used for regular season games only and the home school should notify visitors when it is being used.
- F. NFHS Pitching Distance for Middle School and High School is 43 feet.

IV. TOURNAMENTS

Tournament Play - Each team is permitted a maximum roster of eighteen (18) players whose names shall be submitted to the tournament director prior to participation at each level of tournament play. **Therefore, only 18 players may dress**. Each team shall be allowed a maximum of twenty-two (22) team personnel in the dugout or on the bench.

A. SECTIONAL TOURNAMENT

All Sections must begin the first day of play with a double header. If there are 3 or more teams in your section, you must begin play on Wednesday, May 4th. Less than 3 teams must begin no later than Thursday, May 5th. Exception: Schools may choose to begin sectional play on Monday, May 2nd or Tuesday May 3rd and not have to play a double header on the first day.

The games must be played on consecutive days once the tournament is started (weather permitting) and reverts to single elimination if not completed by rain date.

- 1. The school appearing in BOLD FACE will serve as temporary chairman of each sectional and as such will be responsible for calling a meeting by April 11. It is recommended that a school administrator (principal, assistant principal, athletic director) attend the sectional seeding meeting with the coach. Site, pairings, selection of tournament director, dates, times, officials, awards, etc., shall be established at this meeting. Sectional tournament teams shall be seeded; therefore, it is recommended that teams play all other teams in their section. Sectional tournament play may be single or double elimination. However, the Softball Coaches' Committee has made the following changes to the tournament structure.
 - a. It is recommended that the sectional tournament be double elimination.
 - b. The "best" team should receive a "bye". The "best" team should be determined by using the following criteria:
 - 1) Head to head sectional
 - 2) Regional
 - 3) Overall record

The #1 seeded team receives the bye and the #2 seeded team plays the #3 seed in the 1st game of the double header. The loser of the first game is to play the #1 seed in the second game of the double header. the loser continues to play until someone is eliminated.

The determination of home/visitor team and dug out assignments shall be made at the sectional meeting. For all tournament play, the home team dugout shall be the dugout on the first base line. The "bye" team shall be the home team.

- c. At the sectional meeting, coaches shall reach <u>simple</u> <u>majority</u> decisions concerning the tournament format. Once the format has been established, <u>there is no change</u>. The WVSSAC office prefers that coaches/schools in each section reach agreement without intervention from this office. Intervention from this office is a last resort.
- Tournament Directors are to submit the Sectional Softball Tournament Form Sb1 by April 23.
- 3 Registered Class I or II officials must be used.
- Sectional winners are to send team picture, roster, and team record to Alice Goodwin at the WVSSAC office. The roster form to be completed for the state tournament souvenir program is included in the Coach's Packet.
- Tournament Directors are to submit the Sectional Softball Financial Report Form Sb2 by May 13.

B. REGIONAL TOURNAMENT - Host site will be home team. Regional Semi-Final

- Semi-Final Directors will be responsible for selecting time and officials and for notifying participating schools. The Softball Coaches' Committee recommends the use of four person officiating crews.
- 2. Registered Class I or II officials are to be used.
- 3. Semi-Final Regional Tournament play is single elimination.
- Tournament Directors are to submit the Semi-Final Softball Financial Report Form Sb3 by May 20.



Regional Final

- Regional Directors will be responsible for selecting time and officials and for notifying participating schools.
- 2. Regional Tournament play is single elimination.
- 3. Registered Class I or II officials must be used.
- Tournament Directors are to submit the Regional Softball Financial Report Form Sb4 by May 27.

C. STATE TOURNAMENT (May 25-26)

- The State Tournament will be held at the Jackson Park in Vienna. Norm Harris of Parks & Recreation will serve as Tournament Director. The tournament will be a two (2) day double elimination championship. Karen King and Danny Tennant, AD, Parkersburg Catholic, will assist.
- WVSSAC reimbursement for teams in the state tournament will be for a maximum of twenty (20) including players, managers, and coaches.
- 3. The playing schedule for the three classes will rotate yearly.
- 4. Four person officiating crews will be used.
- 5. Sponsorship and Rights: The WVSSAC is the sponsoring organization for all state tournaments. The WVSSAC reserves all rights in regard to the management of these tournaments, the sale of any items at the tournament site, and any audio or visual reproductions of the events. Any sale, distribution or reproduction of clothing, souvenirs, pictures or other items without the expressed written consent of the WVSSAC is strictly prohibited. Pictures for media or school yearbooks are to be used for these purposes only.

SOFTBALL RULES CLINICS

Schools: The <u>Head Coach</u> shall be required to attend any sport rules clinic in his/her coaching assignment which is sponsored by this Commission. Schools failing to have a head coaching position filled at the time of the clinic are required to have a school representative present at the rules clinic. In a 9-12 school, both the varsity and 9th grade coach are required to attend.

Officials: All officials must attend the clinic to be eligible to work any contests during the season.

The clinic attendance requirement will not be granted if the coach or representative is late in excess of 10 minutes.

2016 SOFTBALL RULE REVISIONS

2-57-4 New: Art 4... Projected Substitute. A projected substitute is the act of entering a substitute without first removing a player from that position in the line-up. (3-3-3).

Rationale: To provide a standard definition for a "projected" substitute and to help clarify Rule 3-3-3.

2016 MAJOR EDITORIAL CHANGES

NOTE: One American flag, not to exceed 2 inches by 3 inches, may be worn or occupy space on the jersey. By state association approval, to allow for special occasions, commemorative or memorial patches, not to exceed 4 square inches, may be worn on jerseys.

2016 POINTS OF EMPHASIS

STRIKE ZONE (FP) DP/FLEX EDUCATION PITCHING (FP)

CERTIFIED BATS

Easton is voluntarily removing the following softball bat models from the ASA/USA list of certified bats: SCN1, SCN11BH, SCN1B, SCN2B, SCN3, SCN4B, SCN5, SCN5B, SCN6B, SCN7, SCN7B, SCN8B, SCN8B, SNC9, SCX14, SCX14B, SCX24B, AND SCX3.

The NFHS Softball Rules Book specifically states that the bat must contain the 2000 or 2004 ASA certification mark and NOT be on the ASA non-approved bat list. Therefore, these bats are no longer permitted in NFHS contests.

Rule 1-5-1d

The ball shall:

d. Meet the 2004 ASA Bat Performance Standard, bear either the 2000 or 2004 certification mark and not be listed on the ASA non-approved bat list as found on http://www.teamusa.org/USA-Softball.aspx. Bat barrels made entirely of wood are permitted and need not bear an ASA mark, but shall not exceed 2-1/4 inches in diameter.

I. GENERAL INFORMATION

- No coaches are required to attend a WVSSAC State Rules Clinic this year. Return Information Verification Form (T3) by March 7th. Coach must complete the Regional Seeding Form (T4) and send it to the Regional Director by April 1.
- Coaches shall present themselves in professional attire suitable for a school representative. Coaches shall be attired in white, gray, black, khaki, or school colors.
- 3. Middle School/9th Grade teams should be allowed to participate in interscholastic contests even if a player must play both a singles match and a doubles match. This allows for a team with as few as six team members to participate in a match with 4 singles matches and 3 doubles matches. Although it is recommended to use as many participants as possible, schools with a low number of participants should not be penalized for using a team member in both singles and doubles.
- 4. Electronic Devices Coaches, players, and officials are not allowed to have cell phones or pagers while they are on-court.

II. RULES AND REGULATIONS

A. REGULATIONS

- Tennis rules published by the United States Tennis Association are the official rules for all interscholastic competition unless otherwise modified by the WVSSAC.
- Middle School/9th Grade Dates Middle School/9th Grades are allowed to play either a fall or spring season. However, the season selected shall be no longer than 12 weeks.
- 3. In order to enter regional play, the position must have been played in at least six matches and the individual must play the position six times. When playing teams inside your region and a player doesn't show or is injured, the team must choose to default or play an exhibition match that will not count towards regional seeding. However, it does count for scoring the regular season match and towards the athletes overall record. When playing outside your region and a player does not show or is injured, the team may choose to default or move players up.
- 4. A team match shall consist of 4 points out of 7 (3 doubles, 4 singles). Schools competing with less than 3 members will count the individual matches but the contest will not count as a team match.
- 5. When two teams are sponsored by a school (boys and girls), the girls must compete against girls, boys against boys. If a school sponsors one co-educational team, that team must compete as a boys' team. This applies to regular season. However, during tournament play, which is individual play, there are no co-educational teams or mixed doubles. Girls compete against girls and boys compete against boys. Clarification If only one girl is on the team, she must play the #1 position (exception to #6) at regional competition.

Players may play both singles and doubles, but it is not mandatory that they do so.

No form of stacking is acceptable.

- In a match, a school must play players in order of ability. This rule applies regardless of the number of players. Example: If a school has 3 players, they shall be put in rank order. The best player would play #1, second best #2, and third best #3.
- 8. In doubles, players shall be placed on doubles teams according to ladder position, i.e., the best two doubles players at #1 doubles, the next two doubles players at #2 doubles, and so on for #3 doubles.
- Players' placement in the doubles need not correspond to their singles placement. For example, the #1 and #2 Singles players need not be the #1 Doubles team.
- 10. Regular season matches will be pro-sets (8 games-with a 12 point tie breaker at 8 games all).
 - Six Game Pro Sets There is no provision for a six game pro set. If a six game pro set match is played, the match will not count in the season record and will be a forfeit.

Tie Breaker - No coaching is allowed during the tie breaker.

- 11. No-Ad Scoring Regular Season Both coaches must mutually agree. If mutual agreement cannot be established, regular scoring will be used. Regional Play No ad scoring may be used at the discretion of the regional tournament director only. State Tournament Scoring decisions will be made by the WVSSAC.
 - a. The USTA has approved a variation of the conventional scoring system for the purpose of shortening the duration of a tennis match. It is called "no-ad scoring" and is precisely what the name implies.
 - b. Singles and Doubles: A game is won by the first player or team to win 4 points; that is if the score goes to 3-points-all (or deuce), the next point decides the game. There is no "advantage" point. Receiver decides to which court the service is delivered on the 7th point.
- If inclement weather causes a match to be cancelled during regular season play, the match will count as completed if four matches have been completed.
- When rescheduling regular season matches, matches with regional opponents should take precedence over non-regional matches.
- 14. The tennis format of 4-3 will be used in all matches in West Virginia. If West Virginia schools play out-of-state opponents, they may play the same format as the home school. In any match, extra players may play as exhibition; however, points are not added to the team score.
- 15. Honest Effort Rule: A player cannot default a match to save energy for another match or default to gain an advantage by not playing. If a student does not adhere to this rule, he/she will be disqualified from the tournament.
- 16. A penalty point deduction on the teams total will be assessed for unsportsmanlike behavior after a player has defaulted or play is complete for all regular season matches, Regional and State.
- 17. Coaches shall use Special Report Forms for unsportsmanlike acts or actions which could not or were not resolved by the use of the Coach's Request for Ruling Form. The Special Report Forms are to be submitted to the WVSSAC.
 - If misconduct occurs, the coach should first consult the coach of the player in question. If that coach fails to issue appropriate sanctions, the other coach may issue appropriate sanctions. A Special Report should then be completed and mailed to the WVSSAC office.
- Saturday Matches 2 out of 3 format may be used if both coaches agree. This is Saturday matches ONLY.



B. UNIFORMS

Participants are required to be in school uniform for all regular season and tournament play. Uniforms must be in school colors. The school approved identification must be on the front of the uniform. Sleeves are not considered to be the front of the uniform. Doubles competition team mates must be attired in the same uniform. It is the responsibility of the match/tournament director and match officials to enforce these regulations. All players middrifts and torsos must be covered.

C. CONDUCT

All teams and players are reminded that <u>only coaches</u> may approach the Tournament Director. Inappropriate contact by players or <u>parents</u> is unacceptable, and warnings and penalties will result.

D. FORFEITS AND DEFAULTS

- If, after an individual match begins, a forfeit occurs due to illness, injury, or penalty for misconduct, the games and set won by the forfeiting team shall stand and count.
- In all other matches, if a default occurs before the individual match begins, then the Tournament Director shall record the score as 6-0 or 8-0.

E. ALTERNATES (Regular Season)

- During the <u>regular season only</u>, substitution for participation will be allowed if the outcome of the match <u>has been decided</u> or for injury or illness
- In non Regional team play, when an alternate is to be used, all players may be moved up; the alternate can be inserted in the slot according to ability.

F. ALTERNATES (Tournament Play)

- Regional and State Competitions are individual competitions. Prior
 to the beginning of any doubles play at the Regional Tournament,
 alternates (doubles) who were listed on the Entry Form may be
 used only in case of illness or injury and only in the position of the
 unavailable player. The alternates must be used in the order in
 which they were placed on the Entry Form. The regional director reserves the right to request medical verification (physician, nurse
 practitioner, athletic trainer).
- If an alternate plays in the first round of doubles play in regionals and the team advances in regionals or to state, the "original" partner may not return to the team. The alternate becomes the partner for the tournament(s).
- If a qualifier to the State Tournament is unable to participate, no substitution may be made. This regulation applies to singles and doubles and will result in a forfeit.

III. REGIONAL TOURNAMENT

For <u>all</u> tournament play, players <u>and</u> coaches must be at courts 30 minutes prior to match. Failure to arrive on time will result in default

A. Regional Tournament (Week 44).

May begin on Monday and continue through completion Saturday, (Rain Dates May 9-10) First Round matches may be played at home site.

In order to avoid date, time, etc., conflicts, coaches should notify players on the first day of the season of the Regional Tournament dates. Regional directors will determine the date(s) which are best considering time and facilities and notify schools as soon as possible.

B. If you only have one coach and your regional/state is at 2 sites, you must provide an additional authorized coach to travel to the other site as needed. This will allow the other teams/players to progress through the tournament.

C. Regional Coaches' Meeting Information

 The Regional Director is responsible for calling a meeting of all coaches and school administrators. If a coach fails to attend the Regional Seed Meeting, all of that school's players will be placed in the blind draw.

- It is recommended that tournament directors make "weather" provisions to secure indoor accommodations with the cost assessed to the individual schools from gate receipts.
- Regional directors are asked, whenever possible, to schedule regional play after school, on Saturday, or on out-of-school days.
- 4. Seeding will be the top four at each of the singles and doubles positions. The remaining placements will be by blind draw. Draw sheets with appropriate "bye" positions will be distributed to each tournament director. The "blind draw" players are to be placed on the remaining lines from top to bottom. Coaches may not choose brackets. The draw goes straight down the draw sheet.
- Teams must play at least 50% of the teams within their assigned region to be eligible to participate in the regional seeding process.
- 6. Seeding for the top four will be based upon the following criteria in the following priority order:
 - 1. Head to Head in Regional Play
 - 2. Number of Regional Matches Played and Won
 - 3. Common Oppenents
 - 4. Strength of Opponents Played
 - 5. Overall Record

USTA ranking is NOT to be considered.

Teams may play each other no more than 2 times to count for seeding purposes.

 Advanced Placement Testing: The regional schedule will not be adjusted or altered for AP testing, prom or other activities. AP students must take the make-up test or forfeit the regional match.

D. General Information

- The Regional Tennis Entry Form must be received by the WVSSAC office by 12:00 noon April 29, 2016. A copy shall also be mailed to the regional tournament director. No alternates are allowed for singles play once the Entry Form is submitted. Alternates for the doubles team are only allowed for injury or illness and prior to the beginning of doubles play and must be used in the order they appear on the Entry Form. No matches played after the 12:00 deadline will count for seeding purposes.
 - a. The Seeding Meeting line-up must coincide with the Enty Form line-up regardless of the date of the meeting.
 - b. Regional Director must return Tennis Seeding Form (T5) to WVS-SAC office by April 1st. It will then be placed on the Website.
- Match Report Forms Match Report Forms (23) shall be taken to the Regional Coaches' Meeting. Failure of the coach to bring match report form to meeting may result in loss of seeding. Should a conflict arise, the decision will be left to the Regional Director.
- All Regional Tournament Directors are to secure roving officials to monitor court behavior and foot faults. All roving officials will be attired in such a way that they are easily recognizable. Directors should refer to Points of Emphasis for more specific information. If the tournament director cannot secure officials, he/she shall assume the responsibility of enforcing all regulations.
- 4. Regional Tournament Directors are asked to secure one trained official for each court. If trained officials are not available, Tennis Coaches' Committee members and tennis knowledgeable individuals shall be chosen first when assigning officials at the regional level. All officials will be attired in such a way that they are easily recognizable. Officials are responsible for keeping spectators at least 10 feet from court fence.
- Regional and state team awards will be based upon individual (singles and doubles) qualifying points accumulated each round.
- A student must complete the qualifying tournament to be eligible to compete at the next level.
- Participants or teams are to supply their own tennis balls. Wilson is the state adopted tournament ball.
- 8. **Time Violations:** Time violations occur when a player takes more



than 20 seconds between points or takes more than 90 seconds on changeovers. A warning shall be given for the first violation. Subsequent delays shall be penalized by a point loss for each violation, with no accumulation.

- Harassment of Players Prohibited: Team members and their spectators shall not harass opposing team players. Harassment directed at individual match is first assessed a warning, next a loss of game, and finally default.
- 10. Bathroom Breaks: A player must ask an official for a designated "bathroom break". The official may refuse this request if he determines that the player is resorting to gamesmanship. WVSSAC will allow reasonable time for bathroom breaks and should take them on a 90-second changeover or Set Break.
- Rest Time Between 8 Game Pro Sets At the tournament director's discretion, a maximum of 30 minutes rest time is allowed between 8 game pro sets during regular season or tournament play.
- 12. If an individual is unable to complete the tournament once it has begun, he/she must forfeit.
- 13. No ad scoring is not allowed in regional tournament play.
- 14. Admission is \$6.00 for adults and \$5.00 for students.

E. Team Awards

A regional team plaque (boys and girls) will be presented for each class. Team winner will be determined by points received by qualifying for each round of the regional tournament. Each round of qualification will award one point (per qualifier, per school). **No team points are awarded for any consolation matches at any position.** Therefore, each position will be played to determine order of finish. For eg. for the #1 position, play will continue until 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th place finishers are determined. In the event of a tie, the following will be considered: number of champions, semi-final finish at any flight, quarter-final finish at any flight, and finish at round (opening round) prior to quarter-finals.

F. Individual Competition

- The regional tournament will be a "flighted" tournament. The following competitions (4-3) will be held for boys and girls: number one singles, number two singles, number three singles, number four singles, number one doubles, number two doubles, and number three doubles. Each school in the region will send one entry for each of the positions/competitions.
- Only the top four at each position will be seeded. To assist in the seeding, all coaches will be required to complete the Match Report Form for all regular season matches and to submit those to the regional tournament director at the Regional Coaches' Meeting.
- All other players will be entered by a "blind" draw. The WVSSAC office will send bracket sheets to each regional director.
- All regional play will be 8 game pro sets with 12 point tie breaker at 8 all. Rest time: maximum of 30 minutes at tournament director's discretion.
- Qualifiers for the state tournament will be determined by the position played. The following will qualify from each of the four regions (boys and girls):

IV. STATE TOURNAMENT (Wednesday-Saturday of Week 45)

- A. The State Tennis Tournament will be held at the Kanawha City Community Center Tennis Courts and Charleston Catholic Athletic Facility, Charleston, WV, with Mike Tompkins as Tournament Director; Bill Malone and Carolyn Tyree, Assistant Directors; John Charnock, Charleston Parks and Recreation Director. Mandatory Coaches Meeting, Wednesday at 6:30 PM.
- B. The State Tennis Tournament will use USTA officials assigned by the WVSSAC.
 - Both court monitor and chair/on-court officials will be used. The USTA official will serve primarily as an observer and preventive mea-

- sure to eliminate rule violations or conflicts; the chair/on-court official will be responsible for calls. The court monitor will be responsible for verifying players' uniforms, calling lines if requested, etc.
- C. Admission for the State Tennis Tournament will be \$8.00 for adults and \$7.00 for students. This is a daily admission fee; pass-outs/ hand stamps will be used each day.

All Session Passes for the three day tournament will be sold at a cost of \$21.00 for adults and \$18.00 for students. These passes are nonrefundable.

- Media No photographers or reporters will be allowed on court (indoor or outdoor) during play.
- E. State Tournament Tentative Schedule
 - Wednesday, 6:30 p.m. Mandatory Coaches Meeting at Kanawha City.
 - 2. Thursday, 8:00 a.m.

- F. The WVSSAC will supply Wilson tennis balls for all State Tournament matches.
- G. Team Competition
 - 1. 1 point for each win in each position.
 - 2. A team champion will be honored in AAA and AA-A.
- H. Doubles
 - Rounds prior to semi finals (first 2 rounds) would be 8 game pro sets. Subsequent matches would be 2 of 3 sets, weather permitting.
 - Seeding of state qualifiers will be based upon order of finish at the regional tournament. Regional pairings would vary each year and with each position and will be determined by the WVSSAC after completion of Regional Tournaments.
- Singles
 - Rounds prior to semi finals (first 2 rounds) would be 8 game pro sets. Subsequent matches would be 2 of 3 sets, weather permitting.
 - Seeding of state qualifiers will be based upon order of finish at the regional tournament. Regional pairings would vary each year and with each position.
- J. Awards
 - 1. Winner and Runner-Up Singles at each position.
 - 2. Winner and Runner-Up Doubles at each position.
 - 3. Team Winner and Runner-Up trophy.
- K. **NOTE:** Reimbursement will end with tournament elimination.

Sponsorship and Rights: The WVSSAC is the sponsoring organization for all state tournaments. The WVSSAC reserves all rights in regard to the management of these tournaments, the sale of any items at the tournament site, and any audio or visual reproductions of the events. Any sale, distribution or reproduction of clothing, souvenirs, pictures or other items without the expressed written consent of the WVSSAC is strictly prohibited. Pictures for media or school yearbooks are to be used for these purposes only.



NFHS Guidelines on Handling Practices and Contests During Lightning or Thunder Disturbances

National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS)
Sports Medicine Advisory Committee (SMAC)

These guidelines provide a default policy to those responsible or sharing duties for making decisions concerning the suspension and restarting of practices and contests based on the presence of lightning or thunder. The preferred sources from which to request such a policy for your facility would include your state high school activities association and the nearest office of the National Weather Service.

Proactive Planning

- 1. Assign staff to monitor local weather conditions before and during practices and contests.
- 2. Develop an evacuation plan, including identification of appropriate nearby safe areas.
- 3. Develop criteria for suspension and resumption of play:
 - a. When thunder is heard within 30 seconds of a visible lightning strike, or a cloud-to-ground lightning bolt is seen, the thunderstorm is close enough to strike your location with lightning. Suspend play for thirty minutes and take shelter immediately.
 - b. Thirty-minute rule. Once play has been suspended, wait at least 30 minutes after the last thunder is heard or flash of lightning is witnessed prior to resuming play.
 - c. Any subsequent thunder or lightning after the beginning of the 30-minute count will reset the clock and another 30-minute count should begin.
- 4. Review annually with all administrators, coaches and game personnel.
- 5. Inform student athletes of the lightning policy at start of season.

For more detailed information, refer to the "Lightning and Thunder Safety" section contained in the NFHS Sports Medicine Handbook.

I. GENERAL INFORMATION

- A. The track format will be Regional and State.
- B. It is the coach's responsibility to enforce the uniform rule (National Federation Rule 4-3).
- C. Shuttle Hurdle Relay for Girls

The race will be 102.5 meters - 10 hurdles

Layout of course:

Start to first hurdle - 13.0 meters

Distance between hurdles - 8.5 meters

Last hurdle to finish line - 13.0 meters

Shuttle Hurdle Relay for Boys

The race will be 110 meters - 10 hurdles

Layout of course:

Start to first hurdle - 13.735 meters

Distance between hurdles - 9.17 meters

Last hurdle to finish line - 13.735 meters

A team may use one marker at each exchange and it must be placed on the line between the team's assigned two lanes.

It is recommended that competition in shuttle should begin in even numbered lanes (2, 4, 6, 8) and end in odd numbered lanes (1, 3, 5, 7).

- D. Pole Vaulter's Weight Verification Form: Coaches are required to process the form and to give a copy of the form to the event judge at ALL meets.
- E. The pole vault landing system should conform to the National Federation rules. See 7-5-7; 7-5-8; 7-5-9; 7-5-10; 7-5-11; 7-5-12; and 7-5-13.

II. RULES AND REGULATIONS

- A. The 16 individual and relay team qualifiers in running, shot, discus and long jump events to the state meet will be determined as follows:
 - Top three (3) individuals and relay teams from each region will qualify.
 - The 13th through 16th qualifying positions will be determined by the next four (4) fastest times/distances from the regional results.
 - The State Meet Games Committee will develop a tie breaking procedure to be instituted if needed. This procedure will be included in the Games Committee Report.
- B. Each Regional Meet will qualify the top four (4) individuals in the high jump and pole vault plus any additional athletes who meet or better the qualifying standard for the State Meet. If there is a tie for 4th place that does not meet the State Qualifying Standard that tie must be worked off utilizing the tie breaking procedure that is normally used for 1st place.

- C. Field implements for shot and discus shall be provided by the WVS-SAC for the state meet. No personal or school implements will be permitted in the throwing venues. A variety of implements will be available for warm-up and competition.
- D. A 34.92-degree sector will be used in the shot put and discus in all meets during the 2015 season by National Federation rule.
- E. Student eligibility must be submitted on line to the WVSSAC before the first meet. All updates must be completed on line before an athlete competes in a meet.

III. TOURNAMENTS

A. REGIONAL TOURNAMENT (Wednesday-Saturday of Week 45)

- It is recommended, but not mandatory, that all Regional Meets held on Wednesday/Thursday/Friday not start until 4:00 p.m.
- 2. Price of admission: Adult \$6.00 Student \$5.00
- 3. Schools are responsible for having updated rosters online.
- The event file for all regional track meets will be posted on the WVSSAC website by May 2, 2016.
- The State Track Meet Games Committee will establish starting heights for the high jump and the pole vault for all Regional Meets. These heights may be adjusted by the Games Committee due to weather.
- The Regional Director will provide a Hy-Tek backup file and a Finish Lynx backup file of all events to the State Meet Directors by 9:00 AM the day after the Regional Meet
- 7. The 4 X 400 (M) Relay will be run using a 3-turn stagger in both the regional and state competitions.
- 8. The 800, 1600, 3200 and 4 X 800 will be run using a oneturn stagger in both regional and state competitions.
- In Regional Meets, coaches will be allowed to scratch and substitute entries from eligibility sheets; however, they will not be allowed to add entries.
- Coaches are responsible for all times turned in to the Regional Director who has the authority to request verification of times.
- 11. Regional Awards: Plaques will be provided for Regional boys' and girls' team winners only. Individual and other team awards will be left to the discretion of the directors and participating schools with the cost covered by the participating schools or other sources.

12. Regional Alignment and Location

There will be a Regional Track Director's Meeting, including Hy-Tek computer operators, at 10:00 a.m. on **Tuesday, April 19, 2016,** at the WVSSAC office. (Regional Directors are REQUIRED to bring their Hy-Tek software users.)

MIDDLE / 9th GRADE TRACK PROGRAM

Refer to the National Federation's 2016 Track and Field Rules Book. This section deals with modifications for conducting middle school competition. The Track Committee has adopted certain changes in these modifications as related to order of events and measurements (weight, height or distance). See previously listed order of events. It is important that all schools follow these contents closely in order to gain a consistency from one track meet to another within our state.

- Organization of meets:
 - Middle Schools may only compete with other middle schools. They may not compete against stand alone 9th grade teams.
 - Middle/9th grade athletes, regardless of grade levels (6, 7, 8, or 9th), may compete in a maximum of four (4) events of which only three (3) may be running events including relays.
- Participation by an individual in two successive running events should be avoided.
- Practice may start Monday of Week 35. Individual members of a team must have practiced on fourteen (14) SEPARATE days, exclusive of the day of a contest, before participating in an interscholastic contest.

- Physical Examination Each student shall have a physical examination before competing with a school team.
- Uniforms and Jewelry Rule (National Federation Rule 4-3)
- Middle school/9th grade teams are permitted 14 meets and only 2 meets per week.
- G. There shall be no State Championship at this level.
- Boys Shot Put (middle/9th grade) 4 kilograms Girls Shot Put (middle/9th grade) - 6 pound

2016 TRACK AND FIELD RULE REVISIONS

- 3-6-4 New, 3-19-3: Changes the responsibility of checking the starting blocks from the implement inspector to the head starter.
- Rationale: Placing the responsibility of inspecting all starting blocks is more appropriate with the starter, who has this expertise, rather than with the implement inspector who has expertise with throwing implements.
- 3-10-7 New: Head event judges may use white and red flags to signal fair or foul for a field event trial.
- Rationale: The use of flags will assist with efficient administration of the field events. Communication between officials, coaches and fans is enhanced by the visual signal, similar to the use of flags by umpires.
- 6-1-1 thru 5, 6-2-9: Expands and clarifies definitions of trial/attempt, flight, round, pass, foul and what determines the initiation of purposeful action of completing the specific throwing event.
- Rationale: Expands the definitions for throwing events for greater clarity in application of the throwing rules and updates to accepted current sport terminology.
- 6-5-2 New: Establishes a maximum diameter for the boys and girls indoor shot puts to account for the synthetic cover.
- Rationale: To account for the thickness of the synthetic covering of an indoor shot, which is not present on the outdoor implement, a maximum diameter is needed in the specifications for the implement.
- 6-6-1: The javelin shall be constructed of metal or other suitable material, which could be wood or newer materials, with a metal point or rubber tip.
- Rationale: Updates the current javelin specifications by eliminating reference to wood, which is no longer a commonly used material. The change will permit use of newer materials, such as carbon fiber, in the construction of the javelin.
- 7-1-1 thru 7, 7-2-1: Expands and clarifies definitions of trial/attempt, flight, round, pass, foul and what determines the initiation of purposeful action of completing the specific jumping event.
- Rationale: Expands the definitions for jumping events for greater clarity in application of the jumping rules and updates to accepted current sport terminology.
- 7-6-3: Updates size of takeoff board to accepted sport specifications by recommending it be 8 inches wide, but permits up to 24 inches.
- Rationale: Updates to accepted current sport equipment specifications for the takeoff board while not resulting in existing boards becoming non-compliant.
- 7-2-2, 6-2-5: Clarifies language regarding when the order of competition may be changed for consistency in all field events and removes duplicate language.
- Rationale: Removes duplicate language contained elsewhere in existing rules and adds language regarding when the order of competition may be changed for consistency in all field event rules.
- 9-1-3b New: Permits the use of double boundary lines marking both the inside and outside boundaries of the cross country course.
- Rationale: The use of the double painted line provides additional guidance to the runners, better defines the race course for spectators, and allows for natural barriers (grasses, hedges, etc.) which appear on many of the newer courses.
- 9-3-3a, b New: Recommends the use of a video/photograph back-up system for cross country when transponders are used for place finish with a review activated when the timing system indicates a one-tenth second or less differential.

Rationale: Recommends the use of a video/photograph back-up system when order of finish in cross country is determined using a transponder system. Transponders can read early or late, come off the runner etc.

The video back-up can confirm close finishes and also assist if other problems arise using the transponder system at the finish line.

9-3-4, 5 New, 9-4-6, 8, 9, 10: A finish corral is recommended at cross country meets in which the transponder system is used for the order of finish.

Rationale: The finish line is opened to its full width when using transponders for order of finish allowing competitors to race through the line. The use of a chute may restrict running space therefore, the corral should be used with transponder place finish. The corral enhances competitors' ability to perform administrative tasks as directed by meet management and then progress in an orderly fashion out of the corral culminating all race activity.

2016_ TRACK CLINICS

Schools: The Head Coach shall be required to attend any sport rules clinic in his/her coaching assignment which is sponsored by this Commission. Both boys and girls head coaches must attend the Rules Clinic. Schools failing to have a head coaching position filled at the time of the clinic will be required to have a school representative present at the rules clinic. In a 9-12 school, both the varsity and 9th grade coach are required to attend.

Officials: All officials are expected to attend the clinic to be eligible to work any contests during the season.
